

Dirty Gloves in Schools Grants Guidelines & Criteria

Please read these guidelines before starting your application

How much funding is available to my school?

Dirty Gloves in Schools grants are up to the value of \$1,000.

How many grants are available in each round?

There will be two grants available in each round and two rounds run each financial year.

Which schools can apply?

Schools must:

- cater to secondary students (including P-10 schools)
- be located in the Eastern Darling Downs region
- be either government or non-government
- have a current School Environmental Management Plan (SEMP) or similar, in some form.

What projects does the Dirty Gloves in Schools grant support?

Projects must relate to the school's SEMP. Some examples might include:

- installing an irrigation system in the school vegie garden
- the purchase of more energy efficient appliances
- tree/vegetation planting to reduce erosion on the school grounds
- improving biodiversity on the school grounds by planting native trees.

This is not a comprehensive list of activities. Any activity that relates to your school's SEMP will be considered. These details can be provided on the application form.

By what criteria will the applications be judged?

Each application will be judged on the following criteria:

- how well the project relates to the SEMP
- the on-ground expected outcomes
- the expected educational outcomes.

What items/activities are not funded by the Dirty Gloves in Schools grant?

Activities which do not add to the sustainability of the school or improve school environment will not be considered.
