- the practical implementation of inspection and clean-down procedures

At the completion of this training the participants will be able to:

- identify a range of regionally and locally significant weeds so that actions to prevent their spread may be undertaken
- utilise the current legislation as the basis for best practice in weed hygiene procedures
- use a risk matrix to determine the need and requirements for undertaking a vehicle clean-down
- inspect and clean-down a vehicle to standard that ensures the prevention of weed seed spread.

Will participants knowledge be recognised?

Successful completion of this training and relevant assessment tasks will provide accreditation in three nationally recognised competencies.

- RTD2803A Observe and report on plants and/or animals
- RTD2312A Inspect machinery for plant animal and soil material
- RTD2313A Clean machinery for plant animal and soil material

This training does not qualify participants as a recognised third party inspector.

Workshop details

This two-day workshop is delivered by qualified trainers and industry experts. Workshop cost is \$5500 (inclusive of GST) for a maximum of 12 participants and includes all training materials and accreditation fees and catering (morning tea, lunch afternoon tea), but does not include travel, accommodation or breakfast and evening meals.

Participants will require a minimum of one vehicle between two participants on which to conduct practical clean-down and inspection activities.
