Agricultural Land Classification in Queensland

Land is mapped into four classes (A, B, C and D) and each class A, B and C is further mapped into sub-classes. Land Classes are described below.

A – Crop Land

Land that is suitable for current and potential crops with limitations to production which range from none to moderate levels.

A1 – Limitations to crop production range from none to moderate levels.

A2 – Horticultural land.

B – Limited Crop Land

Land that is marginal for current and potential crops due to severe limitations; and suitable for pastures.

Engineering and/or agronomic improvements may be required before the land is considered suitable for cropping.

B1 - Land currently unsuitable for continuous cropping but may become suitable following a change in technology or other factors eg economics, water availability.

B2 - Land mapped as B2 is considered complex landscapes of Class A Land with areas of Class C or Class D land.

C – Pasture Land

Land that is suitable only for improved or native pastures due to limitations which preclude continuous cultivation for crop production; but some areas may tolerate a short period of ground disturbance for pasture establishment.

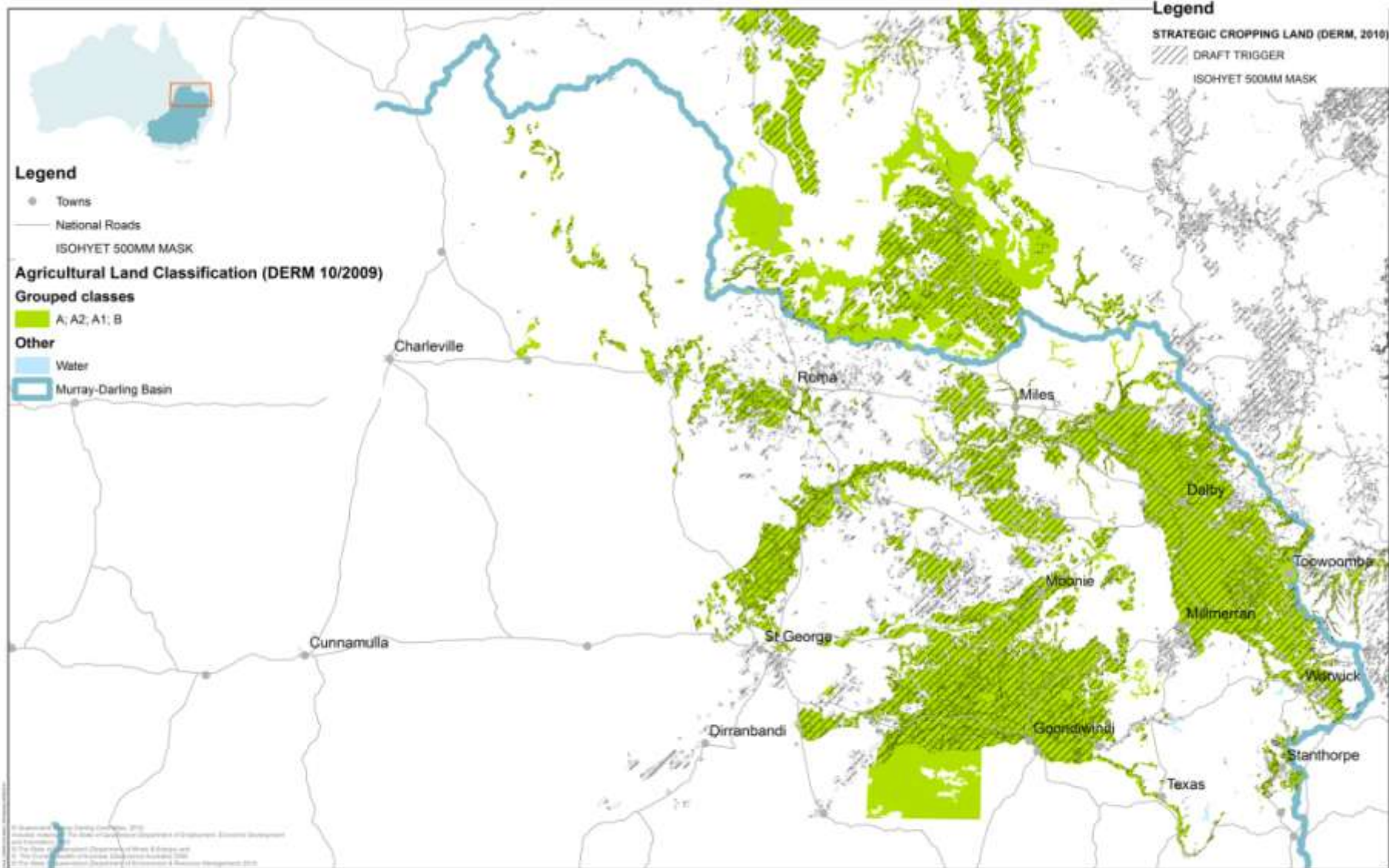
C1 - Land mapped as C1 is considered not suitable for cropping but is suitable for high quality native pastures and for establishing improved pasture.

C2 - Land mapped as C2 is suitable for native pastures, but generally will not sustain current techniques to establish improved pasture. Land mapped as C2 may be suited to native forestry.

D – Non-Agricultural Land

Land not suitable for agricultural uses due to extreme limitations. This may be undisturbed land with significant habitat, conservation and/or catchment values or land that may be unsuitable because of very steep slopes, shallow soils, rock outcrop or poor drainage.

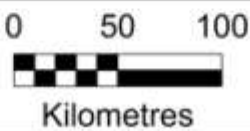

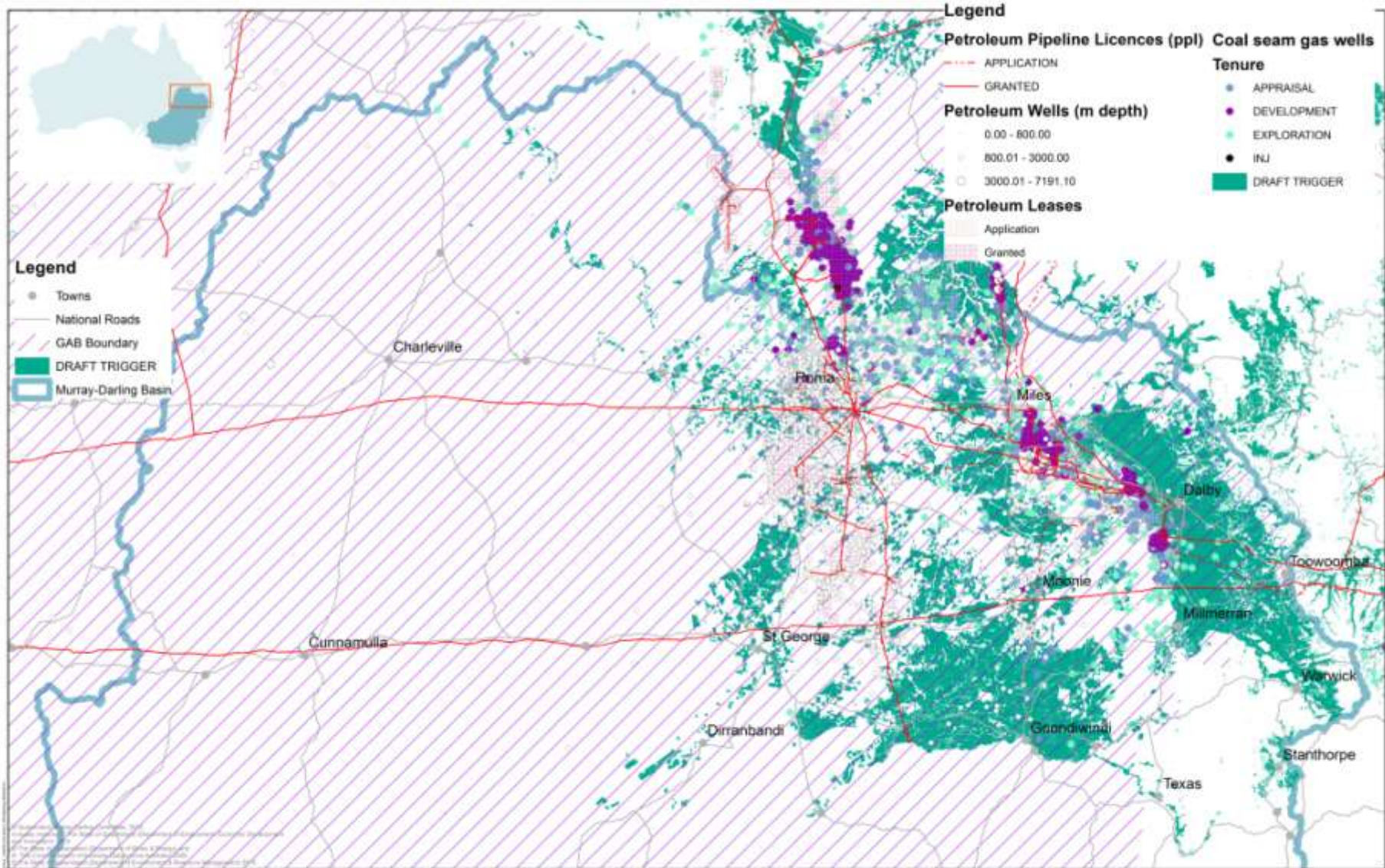

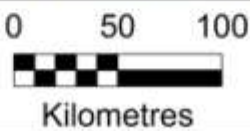

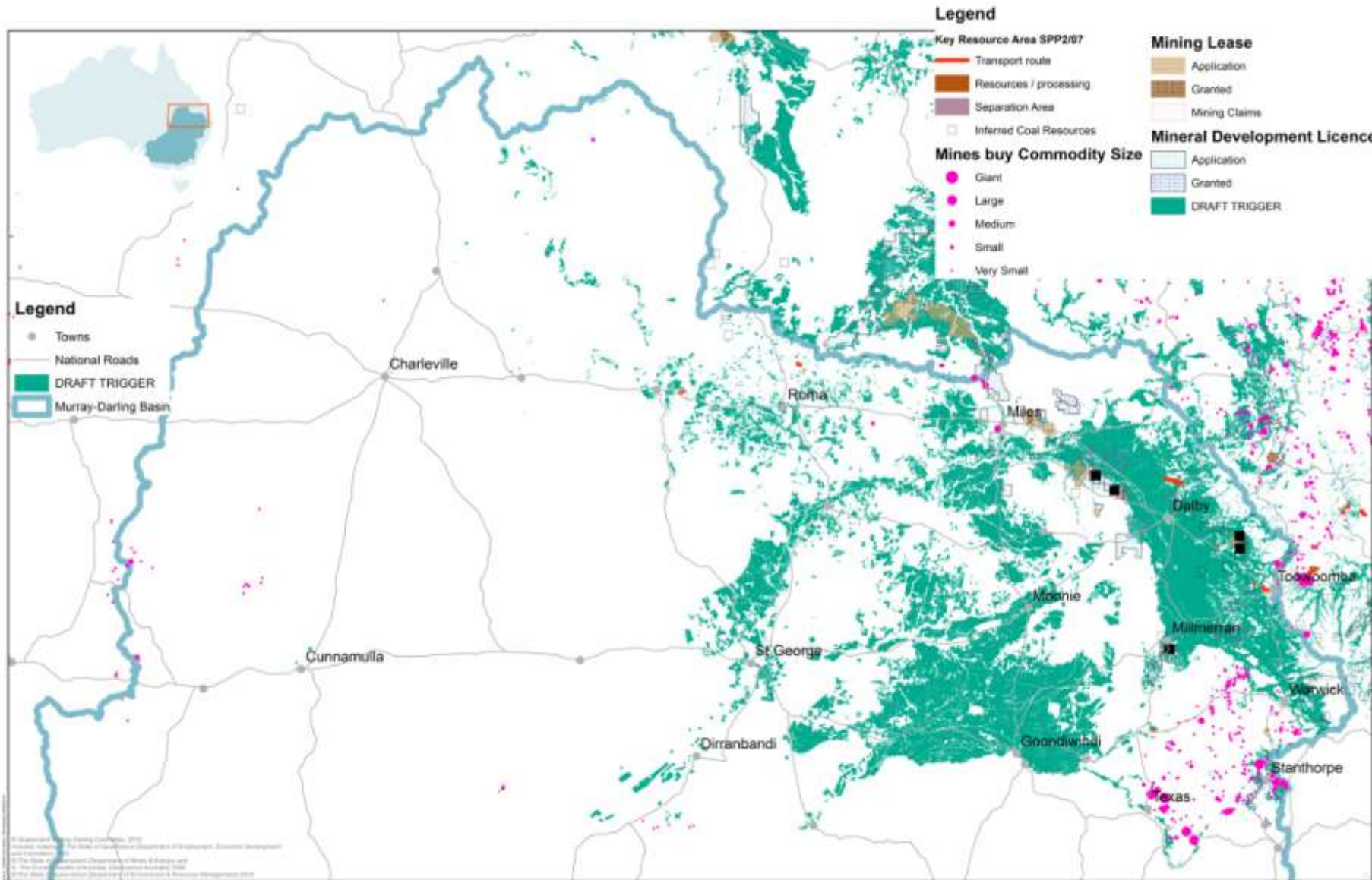
